Through the MATS program, students are exclusively trained in the rich theological tradition of the Catholic Church and prepared for further graduate studies. Through the ILEM and MAPL programs, students are provided a holistic formation experience in the spiritual, human, intellectual, and pastoral dimensions so as to better serve as catechists, PCL's, DRE's, youth ministers, marriage ministers, prison ministers, pastoral associates, and much more!

#### A Commitment to Serve and Make a Difference

Service is the cornerstone of the Handing on the Faith scholarship program. After graduation, Handing on the Faith scholarship recipients are required to commit to two to three years of ministry in the Archdiocese of New Orleans or to repay all or portions of the scholarship funding in order to support others in need of financial assistance. The Handing on the Faith scholarship guidelines provide more background on eligibility and service commitment.
